#### **Administrative Matters**

- a) Call Meeting to Order Meeting was called to order at 10:00 am
- b) Moment of Remembrance for the Passing of Mark Spross
- c) Housekeeping, Roll Call: Board Administrator Partner

#### d) Old Business

I. Review and approval of June meeting minutes. Minutes were approved.

#### e) New Business

- I. Eastern MAC Coordination Discussion
  - Bryan Lee discussed lessons learned, success and plans to continue making progress for the next event. Mike Harryman commented that LGEMAC is to make recommendations relating to response and recovery efforts. There may be an opportunity for the council to meet with the Director and Legislative Coordinator at OEM to discuss possible recommendations for legislative bills relating to the activations. Jake Shores acknowledged the importance of bringing the issues and the wins forward. Bryan and his EMAC team are developing a Basecamp file folder filled with fillable, ready-to-go forms for counties to utilize. Erin McMahon asked if the goal would be to build up a MAC-type group to replicate the summer's efforts or to build up the Regional Coordinator program. Discussion recognized that both were valuable. RCs do not have the lens or contacts of local EMs and so a mix of both would be best. Jonna added that there is a direct benefit to have EMs learn from each other and support each other in events like this. She also discussed EPAC and LGEMAC potentially working together on a project that EPAC has already begun, looking at how successful emergency management funding works in other areas of the country. Justin Gibbs discussed the potential benefits of a Statewide Crisis Management Software system, allowing the sharing of documents, information and coordination efforts. Mike Harryman asked if LGEMAC had a workplan and recommended that the acronym to LMAC. Both were acknowledged by the Chair.
- II. EMPG Funding Formula Committee Update: Carole Carole Sebens, OEM SPIRE Grant Manager, presented a PowerPoint which is available under Meeting Presentations and Documents: <u>https://www.oregon.gov/oem/councils-andcommittees/pages/local-government-emergency-management-advisory-council-(lgemac).aspx</u>. LGEMAC has been asked to review and make recommendations on this formula between the end of the year and February. Jonna mentioned the strong support that Director McMahon has given behind the scenes for local emergency managers. She also brought up the current budget with the State Agencies only able to increase their General Fund by 1%. OEM receives a small percentage of funding through General Fund and so this will impact the agency's ability to replace OpsCenter if other funding allocations are not considered.
